JUNE KING MCFEE AWARD

The **June King McFee Award** is given annually to honor an individual who has made distinguished contributions to the profession of art education, and one who has brought distinction to the field through an exceptional and continuous record of achievement in scholarly writing, research, professional leadership, teaching, or community service.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- The nominee can be an art educator at any level who has demonstrated distinguished contributions to the field of art education.
 The current president and president-elect of the Executive Board of the NAEA Women's Caucus may not be nominated.
- Current membership of nominee in NAEA.

NOMINATION PROCESS: Any member of the NAEA Women's Caucus may submit nominations. The nomination announcement of this award will appear in the NAEA News.

REQUIRED APPLICATION MATERIALS:

- Completed WC Award Application Form (this includes the nominator's letter and nominee statement)
- Attached Current Vita of the nominee.
- Attached Letters of Support: Letters of recommendation from three established art educators.

Extra letters sent to the Chair of the Selection Committee will be returned to the nominator.

DEADLINE: Send the nomination packet in digital form as PDF document to the Award Chair by **NOV 15** preceding the NAEA Annual Convention.

SELECTION PROCESS:

- 1. A *six-person selection committee* (five voting members plus a non-voting chair) will select the recipient of the June King McFee Award.
- 2. The **selection committee** will include as one of its members, the President of the Women's Caucus.
- 3. Other suggested committee members are as follows: an established art educator, an early professional art educator, an arts administrator, and the June King McFee Award Coordinator who is the non---voting Chair.
- 4. At least three members of the selection committee should be members of the NAEA Women's Caucus.

5. The selection committee will make its recommendation to the Women's Caucus Executive Board for affirmation.

The announcement of the recipient and the time and place of the award may be announced in the NAEA WC Column in NAEA News and the web site. If there is no qualified nominee, the June King KcFee Award will not be presented.
